

Luzerne County, PA GO Debt Rating Raised To 'BBB-' On Improved Operations, Management

04-Aug-2017 11:53 EDT View Analyst Contact Information NEW YORK (S&P Global Ratings) Aug. 4, 2017--S&P Global Ratings has raised its general obligation (GO) debt rating on Luzerne County, Penn. to 'BBB-' from 'BB+'. The outlook is stable.

"The upgrade reflects improved operating performance and management conditions over the past year," said S&P Global Ratings credit analyst Timothy Little, "and based on improved budgeting practices and implemented structural reforms, we no longer consider there to be political instability and gridlock weakening operations." Since our last review, the county council has hired a new county manager, repealed its homestead exemption, and adopted a structurally balanced 2017 budget.

Luzerne County, with an estimated population of 317,544, is in northeastern Pennsylvania. The county seat is Wilkes-Barre.

"The stable outlook reflects our expectation that budgetary flexibility will remain very weak and our view of management conditions will remain weak over the next year," added Mr. Little, "and our opinion of such conditions will continue to constrain the rating." The county has made strides toward improving its reserves and adopting structural reforms over the past year, but we remain cautious as to whether the implementation of such reforms will continue over the long term given our prior assessment of management conditions. We do not expect to change our rating within the next year.

If the county can continue to implement the structural reforms in its long-term financial plan while improving its budgetary flexibility and liquidity, we may raise the rating. Conversely, if it reverts to adopting structurally imbalanced budgets or liquidity worsens due to uneven cash management practices, we may lower the rating.

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
