Annual Audited Financial Statements or CAFR will be filed under separate cover letter and simultaneously on the SEC EMMA website with this Continuing Disclosure Report. The Board of Governors has in place numerous Post Issuance Compliance policies and debt management policies which are reviewed by a group of designated campus and system officials to ensure that investor funds are used in an appropriate manner and federal and state laws, policies and regulations are adhered too.

The reclassification and restatement resulted in a decrease to beginning net position of \$2.8 million for fiscal year 2013. This implementation also caused a decrease to the change in net position of \$796 thousand, creating an ending net position adjustment of \$3.6 million for the year ended June 30, 2013.

<sup>3</sup> With the implementation of GASB Statement No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions-an amendment to GASB Statement No. 27, no restatements to the prior fiscal year have been made however, the fiscal year 2015 beginning net position has been adjusted to reflect the change in accounting principle. The financial statements, while a presentation of the current and prior fiscal year, will not be comparable for this reason. The total decrease to the beginning net position of \$487.8 million is comprised of the establishment of deferred outflows of resources, deferred inflows of resources, and net pension liability.
